- 1. One of our tasks is to be relevant where we are placed.
- 2. To be relevant we have to have <u>something</u> to offer the world so that we can have the opportunity to take the Kingdom with us into those spheres.
- 3. Destiny. All of us have dreams and visions in us that have not been fulfilled.
- 4. Most of us don't want to go where we have to go, to get what we've already got.
- 5. We would rather have the dream come to us.
- 6. In our arena within the world, we take **what we have of the Kingdom** that God has given us to deliver, and use it to solve problems or meet needs.
- 7. We should do this in a way that is **totally non-religious**.
- 8. At the end of the day you win the game when **they are convinced you are <u>right</u>** and they are <u>wrong</u>, and they want to know more about what you think.
- 9. It is a good idea to know what the enemy's goals are so that we develop a strategy to defeat him.
- 10. Satan's main objective is 'to deceive the nations'.1
- 11. Satan does not want the nations to know that Jesus is the solution to their problems, or that the nations were designed to **reveal Jesus' glory**, or that the glory is hidden in the nations.
- 12. The reason Satan can deceive the nations is because the church is more <u>occupied</u> with Jesus coming, than <u>occupying</u> until He comes.
- 13. The millennial period is:
  - the binding of deception off the earth.
  - the time when evil will be limited to within mankind only. (i.e. No evil force will drive it along for 1,000 years.<sup>2</sup>)
- 14. **Success** is not measured by success itself.
- 15. Success is not measured from taking territory, although that is the desired outcome.
- 16. True success is whether we are a credible testimony to the Gospel of the Kingdom.
- 17. Our rewards in heaven are linked to the fidelity we have toward our assignment.
- 18. How we handle our assignments on Earth influences the assignments we are given in the Millennium.
- 19. Christians generally ignore eternal rewards and have a huge hang up about them.
- 20. God made us and as such, we have in our nature the desire for rewards.
- 21. It is not capitalistic to seek eternal rewards because we are commanded to do so by Jesus!<sup>3</sup>
- 22. The demonstration of the Gospel of the Kingdom: The <u>future</u> rule of Christ invading time right <u>now</u>.
- 23. It is simply not good enough just to show up you have to show off the Kingdom!

- 24. What people do when that happens determines the judgement of God on a nation or a system.
- 25. This is serious stuff because once the Kingdom has been revealed, **ignorance is no longer an** excuse.
- 26. The 'fish tank' you are in will determine the maximum size of your ministry.
- 27. We should be open to being called to a bigger fish tank if this is what God has planned for us.
- 28. This is how we are able to unveil our glory.

## Summary.

- To be able to unveil the glory in us we have to be relevant where we are placed.
- The 'game' is won when they are convinced you are right and want to know more of the Kingdom.
- Success is measured by our ability to give a credible testimony of the Gospel of the Kingdom.
- What people or a nation does when this happens determines how God will judge them.
